

Dear Colleagues:

Welcome to San Francisco and welcome to Bay Area Physicians for Human Rights' Second Annual Symposium on health care issues affecting gay men and lesbians.

Our program has been designed to provide accurate and up-to-date information on a variety of medical and psychological topics. To accomplish this objective our faculty has been chosen because of their expertise in a particular area, and because of their experience and work with various segments of the gay community.

It should be kept in mind that the "gay community" is composed of extremely diverse elements. Many of these elements have little in common except their sexual orientation. Even that is not precisely the same for all individuals labelled as "homosexual". The failure to recognize this diversity has often resulted in stereotyping of gay individuals. In medicine, observations or research on small populations may often be inappropriately accepted as representative of all gay men and lesbians. Participants in this Symposium are urged to exercise care in making generalizations about gay men and lesbians and in evaluating the applicability of findings of our speakers to the "gay community".

Our educational efforts on the subject of homosexuality will be greatly enhanced by your participation in this program. There will be time for questions and discussion following each presentation. Your evaluation of this program is particularly important to us in determining educational needs and formats which will be of value in the future.

On behalf of Bay Area Physicians for Human Rights, I hope that you will find this program a rewarding educational experience and your stay in San Francisco a rewarding personal experience.

SYMPOSIUM FACULTY

DONALD ABRAMS, M.D. San Francisco, California

Donald Abrams, M.D. is a fellow in Hematology-Oncology at the Cancer Research Institute, University of California, San Francisco. He received an A.B. degree from Brown University, an M.D. degree from Stanford University and completed his training in Internal Medicine at the Kaiser Foundation Hospital in San Francisco. He is engaged in research on persistent lymphadenopathy in homosexual men and he has been a participant in the Kaposi's Sarcoma Clinic at the University of California. He has given presentations on the subject of Kaposi's Sarcoma at various hospitals and he was recently invited to present a program on Kaposi's to the newly forming gay physicians group in Hawaii. Doctor Abrams has been an active member of BAPHR since his days in medical school.

BRONWYN D. ANTHONY, Ph.D. West Hollywood, California

Bronwyn D. Anthony, Ph.D. is a Clinical Psychologist with a private practice in West Hollywood, California. She has been Co-chair of the Women's Programs of the Los Angeles chapter of the Lesbian and Gay Academic Union for the past two years, Co-chair of the 5th National Conference of the Gay Academic Union in 1978, and Steering Committee member of the Association of Gay Psychologists from 1979 to 1981. She has also given numerous workshops and talks concerning lifestyle issues of lesbians and gay men to such groups as social workers at Veteran's Administration hospitals, the UCLA School of Public Health, the USC Department of Clinical Psychology, the California Family Study Center, and the UCLA School of Social Work. She is the author of an article, "Lesbian Client-Lesbian Therapist: Challenges and Opportunities in Working Together", which is currently in press and will be published in the special upcoming double issue of the Journal of Homosexuality.

Robert K. Bolan, M.D. San Francisco, California

Robert K. Bolan, M.D. is currently involved in family practice in San Francisco, he is Medical Director of the Gay Health Care Clinic of Presbyterian Hospital and a Clinical Instructor at the University of California, Division of Family and Community Medicine. Doctor Bolan has also been an organizer and clinical faculty member of a new elective course "Clinical Approach to Gay and Lesbian Health Care", offered by the University of California Medical School. He has been active in Bay Area Physicians for Human Rights. He was secretary of that organization for one year and currently is Chair of the BAPHR Task Force on Kaposi's Sarcoma, Chair of the BAPHR Task Force on Amyl and Butyl Nitrite, and Chair of the BAPHR Research Committee.

Steven P. Borkovic, M.D. San Francisco, California

Steven P. Borkovic, M.D. is a graduate of the Brown University Program in Medicine and is currently a resident in Dermatology at the University of California in San Francisco. He is also a member of Bay Area Physicians for Human Rights, The American Association of Physicians for Human Rights, and the Gay and Lesbian Caucus of the University of California, San Francisco.

He became interested in the problems of Kaposi's Sarcoma in Gay men and was able to work with the University of California's Kaposi Sarcoma Clinic. In addition to having co-authored two recent articles on the subject, he has lectured to various local groups in the Bay Area.

ROBERT A. BUSH, JR., M.D., F.A.C.S. San Francisco, California

Robert A. Bush, Jr., M.D., F.A.C.S., is an Assistant Clinical Professor in the Department of Surgery at the University of California, San Francisco. He is a consultant to the Proctology Clinic at San Francisco General Hospital and is engaged in a private practice of General and Colon and Rectal Surgery in San Francisco.

MICHAEL J. CATANZARO, M.S. Long Beach, California

Michael J. Catanzaro, M.S., is a licensed Marriage, Family and Child Counselor. He is the Director of Staff Development for the Alcohol Recovery Service at the Naval Regional Medical Center in Long Beach and has been involved in the establishment of training programs and family therapies for the Alcohol Rehabilitation Service since 1972. Among his other accomplishments are the establishment and direction of a Long Beach Drug Abuse Treatment Program to serve Long Beach and San Pedro area for a period of six years, directing the composition of a three-year grant of \$1,500,000 with the National Institute of Drug Abuse, development of a counseling program for hard-core juvenile offenders in Washington, D.C. from 1961-1965, and the direction of a Medical Clinic in the jungles of Bolivia, during 1967 and 1968. He is a co-founder of Friends of Gays of Southern California.

WILLIAM J. KAPLA, M.D. San Francisco, California

William J. Kapla, M.D. is engaged in a family practice in San Francisco. Prior to the establishment of his private practice, Doctor Kapla worked extensively as an emergency physician. He is a Clinical Instructor in the Department of Family and Community Medicine at the University of California, San Francisco. He has been actively involved in educational projects concerning homosexuality including serving as Chair of BAPHR's Education Committee and Chair of BAPHR's first Symposium. Currently he is Treasurer of Bay Area Physicians for Human Rights.

DOUGLAS C. KIMMEL, Ph.D. New York, New York

Douglas C. Kimmel, Ph.D. is Professor of Psychology at the City College of City University of New York.

He is a Fellow of the Gerontological Society of America, a member of the Committee on Gay Concerns of the American Psychological Association, past Chairperson of the Steering Committee of the Association of Gay Psychologists, past Co-chairperson of the Board of Directors (and a founding member) of Senior Action in a Gay Environment, Inc. in New York City, and has been an invited participant in conferences on aging sponsored by the American Psychological Association.

The author of <u>Adulthood and Aging</u>, published by Wiley in 1974, with a second edition in 1980, he has published eleven journal articles and five chapters in edited books on topics such as aging gay men, retirement, adult development, and adolescence. A licensed psychologist, he is listed in the National Register of Health Service Providers Psychology and had a private practice in New York City from 1974 to 1981.

Currently he is on leave, living in Maine with Ron, his partner of thirteen years, and their dog, Shep, working on co-authored texts on adolescence and lifespan development.

R. DALE McGHEE, M.D. Stanford, California

R. Dale McGhee, M.D. is the Chief of Urology at the Kaiser-Permanente Medical Center in Santa Clara, California. He also is a Clinical Instructor in Urology at Stanford University. He is an authority on male sexual physiology and microsurgical arterial bypass in vasculogenic impotence. In addition to his clinical work he is currently involved in research on impotence. Doctor McGhee has been the President of Bay Area Physicians for Human Rights for the past two years and has also been active in the Gay Fathers Organization.

PATRICK J. McGRAW, M.D. San Francisco, California

Patrick J. McGraw, M.D. is in private family practice in San Francisco after training in Pennsylvania at Jefferson Medical College, Philadelphia and St. Margaret Hospital in Pittsburgh.

Currently, a Clinical Instructor at Stanford University in the Department of Family Practice, he is also the co-founder and President of the Resource Foundation which is a non-profit community organization committed to ending the epidemic of Hepatitis B.

DENNIS J. McSHANE, M.D. Menlo Park, California

Dennis J. McShane, M.D. is a Clinical Assistant Professor of Medicine (Immunology) at Stanford University. He is Board Certified in Internal Medicine and Rheumatology. He is the author of several publications in the field of Rheumatology and has been extensively involved in the application of Computers to the field of medicine. He has been actively involved in the founding of the American Association of Physicians for Human Rights and currently serves as the first president of that organization.

DAVID P. McWHIRTER, M.D. San Diego, California

David P. McWhirter, M.D. is a Board Certified Psychiatrist as well as a Board Certified Sexologist. He received his bachelor's degree in biology from Loyola University of Los Angeles and his M.D. degree from the School of Medicine, University of Southern California in 1958. He is currently the Medical Director of the Clinical Institute for Human Relationships in San Diego. He is also an Assistant Professor of Clinical Psychiatry at the University of California San Diego School of Medicine.

Andrew M. Mattison, Ph.D. is a licensed Clinical Psychologist, a member of the Academy of Certified Social Workers and a Board Certified Sexologist.
